



⁴⁶ So he came again to Cana in Galilee, where he had made the water wine. And at Capernaum there was an official whose son was ill. ⁴⁷ When this man heard that Jesus had come from Judea to Galilee, he went to him and asked him to come down and heal his son, for he was at the point of death. ⁴⁸ So Jesus said to him, "Unless you[a] see signs and wonders you will not believe." ⁴⁹ The official said to him, "Sir, come down before my child dies." ⁵⁰ Jesus said to him, "Go; your son will live." The man believed the word that Jesus spoke to him and went on his way. ⁵¹ As he was going down, his servants met him and told him that his son was recovering. ⁵² So he asked them the hour when he began to get better, and they said to him, "Yesterday at the seventh hour the fever left him." ⁵³ The father knew that was the hour when Jesus had said to him, "Your son will live." And he himself believed, and all his household. ⁵⁴ This was now the second sign that Jesus did when he had come from Judea to Galilee.

JOHN 4:46-54

For John, these signs are not the main event, but rather they are all signs pointing to someone greater: a reality more important for the original hearers and readers. John has deliberately chosen these seven signs out of many others so that we might believe in Jesus (John 20:30–31). Jesus is more than just a miracle worker, but rather he is the Son of God.

■ GUIDE QUESTIONS

(NUMBERED ACCORDING TO LEVEL OF DEPTH AND READINESS TO SHARE)

- On a scale from 1-10 (1 being never/not at all and 10 being always/extremely) how would you
 rate your capacity to believe that God still does miracles today? Why have you rated yourself
 this way?
- 2. Have you had the opportunity to share with someone else of a miracle you or your family have experienced? How did they respond?
- 3. Consider the official who went to Jesus and asked him twice to heal his son. Jesus told him to return to his son as he had been healed and in turn his household believed. Would you respond the same way in asking for a miracle from Jesus, by asking him twice? If yes, have you invited others to experience what you have experienced in Jesus? If no, what might be your hesitation?
- 4. What miracles are you believing for or seen come to pass? How has your faith grown whilst believing for the miracle to come to pass and what of the attributes of Jesus have become known?

If you are not yet a follower of Jesus, would you choose today to trust him? Will you enable him to have all authority as the one who calls the shots in your life? Would you like to enter into a saving relationship with God through Jesus? Ask your Life Group leader to lead you in prayer to receive Christ. You can pray this prayer:

Dear Lord Jesus, I know that I am a sinner, and I ask for your forgiveness. I believe you died for my sins and rose from the dead. I turn from my sins and invite you to be the master of my life. I want to trust and follow you as my Lord and Saviour. I declare that I am yours, and you are mine. In Jesus' name, Amen.
