## WORD

7 Be patient, therefore, brothers, until the coming of the Lord. See how the farmer waits for the precious fruit of the earth, being patient about it, until it receives the early and the late rains. 8 You also, be patient. Establish your hearts, for the coming of the Lord is at hand. 9 Do not grumble against one another, brothers, so that you may not be judged; behold, the Judge is standing at the door. 10 As an example of suffering and patience, brothers, take the prophets who spoke in the name of the Lord. 11 Behold, we consider those blessed who remained steadfast. You have heard of the steadfastness of Job, and you have seen the purpose of the Lord, how the Lord is compassionate and merciful.

12 But above all, my brothers, do not swear, either by heaven or by earth or by any other oath, but let your "yes" be yes and your "no" be no, so that you may not fall under condemnation.

13 Is anyone among you suffering? Let him pray. Is anyone cheerful? Let him sing praise. 14 Is anyone among you sick? Let him call for the elders of the church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord. 15 And the prayer of faith will save the one who is sick, and the Lord will raise him up. And if he has committed sins, he will be forgiven. 16 Therefore, confess your sins to one another and pray for one another, that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person has great power as it is working. 17 Elijah was a man with a nature like ours, and he prayed fervently that it might not rain, and for three years and six months it did not rain on the earth. 18 Then he prayed again, and heaven gave rain, and the earth bore its fruit.

James 5:7-18 (ESV)



1. Share examples of how steadfastness in the midst of hardship can be a powerful testimony of God's faithfulness to others.

2. Discuss the connection between worshiping and trusting God in the midst of hardship, as highlighted in James 5:13-16. How does worshiping God in difficult times strengthen our trust in Him? Share personal experiences of how prayer and worship have sustained you during challenging seasons of life.

3. Brainstorm practical ways to cultivate steadfastness in your daily walk with Christ, especially during times of adversity.

4. Share stories of individuals who have demonstrated remarkable faith and patience in the midst of adversity, inspiring others with their testimony.

If anyone desires to trust Jesus in the midst of trial or to receive Him as their Lord and Saviour, they can pray this prayer:

"Lord Jesus, in the midst of trials and suffering, I choose to trust in Your unfailing love and sovereignty. Give me the strength and perseverance to remain steadfast in my faith, knowing that You are with me always. I confess my sins and invite You to be the Lord of my life. Thank You for dying on the cross for my sins and rising again. Come into my life and transform me from the inside out. In Your name, Amen."
