#### Reflections

The Wonder of God's Love Coming Down

This season isn't just about receiving; it's about reflecting the love that first came down to us. How might God be leading you to give as Christ gave during this Christmas season?

- 3. "Have you ever experienced someone showing you kindness or grace when you didn't deserve it? How did it make you feel?
- 4. "What do you think makes Christmas feel different from other times of the year? Is it about gifts, family, or something deeper?"
- 5. "If love is meant to be shared, what are some simple, practical ways we can bring hope or joy to the people around us this season?"
