“What’s the most creative or memorable gift you’ve ever given or received? Why did it stand out to you?”

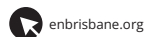


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WORD

“The point is this: whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to make all grace abound to you, so that having all sufficiency in all things at all times, you may abound in every good work. As it is written, ‘He has distributed freely, he has given to the poor; his righteousness endures forever.’

He who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will supply and multiply your seed for sowing and increase the harvest of your righteousness. You will be enriched in every way to be generous in every way, which through us will produce thanksgiving to God. For the ministry of this service is not only supplying the needs of the saints but is also overflowing in many thanksgivings to God. By their approval of this service, they will glorify God because of your submission that comes from your confession of the gospel of Christ, and the generosity of your contribution for them and for all others, while they long for you and pray for you, because of the surpassing grace of God upon you. Reflections

God’s Generosity Displayed in Christ

Christmas is a season that celebrates the generosity of God, who gave us His “inexpressible gift”—Jesus Christ. In 2 Corinthians 9:6-15, Paul reminds us that God’s generosity is not just about material provision but about the grace that abounds in our lives. God, in His love, sent His Son not because we earned it but as an act of sheer generosity and grace.

The passage also challenges us to live generously, trusting in God’s ability to provide for all our needs. Proverbs 3:5-6 encourages us to trust in the Lord with all our hearts and not rely on our own understanding. This is countercultural in a world that often values self-sufficiency. God’s economy works differently—when we trust in Him and live generously, He multiplies what we have for His glory.

Overcoming Feelings of Unworthiness

One of the barriers to receiving God’s generosity is the sense of unworthiness. Many struggle to believe that such grace could be freely given. But the Gospel-centered truth is that God’s love and grace are not about what we deserve but about His character. As we embrace this truth, we are freed from the pressure to perform and the fear of not measuring up.

Paul then highlights that generosity is a form of worship. It’s not merely about giving financially but about offering our lives in service and gratitude. When we give cheerfully, we reflect God’s heart, and our giving leads to thanksgiving and glory to God.

As we celebrate God’s generosity this Christmas, we are invited to reflect that generosity in our own lives—not just in gifts but in time, encouragement, and acts of kindness. This season offers countless opportunities to be the hands and feet of Jesus to a world in need.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. “What does generosity look like to you? How have you experienced generosity in your life?”
2. “Why do you think it’s hard for some people to trust in God’s provision or to receive gifts of grace and love?”
3. “Have you ever felt God’s provision in an unexpected way? How did that experience impact your trust in Him?”
4. “What are some practical ways we can reflect God’s generosity this Christmas season, especially to those who might feel overlooked or in need?”
5. “How can we cultivate a lifestyle of generosity during Christmas? What about throughout the year?”
